Undergraduate applications



What is undergraduate study?

Undergraduate study usually refers to study at bachelor degree level. It can also refer to associate degrees and higher education diplomas.

An undergraduate student is someone who has not yet received their first degree. It is possible to complete more than one undergraduate degree though.

When to apply

Applications open in early August before the year of admission. Key dates for applications are available on the SATAC website. Check the key dates for information about course closing dates. We encourage applications for semester 1 courses before 30 September to avoid paying a higher processing fee.

How to apply

All applicants must apply online at satac.edu.au. The SATAC website provides a range of information about the SATAC application process. Before you get started, you should be familiar with the requirements of applying, as they affect your chances of getting an offer. They include:

- key dates and deadlines for applications
- SATAC fees and charges
- selection criteria for courses
- supporting documents (if required) for your qualifications

Choosing courses

One of the benefits of applying through SATAC is applying for more than one course at the same time.

In a single undergraduate application you can apply for up to six courses, offered by eight institutions, starting at different times of the year. You only need to fill in one application form and supply supporting information once.

Offers

SATAC makes undergraduate offers on behalf of our participating institutions.

Undergraduate offer rounds run on set dates during the admissions cycle. Offer round dates are published on our website.
